Al-Duraz Primary Girls School Al-Duraz - Northern Governorate Kingdom of Bahrain



Introduction

The Directorate of Government Schools Reviews (DGS), which is a part of the Education and Training Quality Authority (BQA), conducted this review over three days by a team of six reviewers. During the review, reviewers observed lessons and other activities, scrutinised students' written works and analysed the school's performance data and other documents. They spoke to the staff, students and parents. This report summarises their findings and recommendations.

Judgement justifications

- Students achieve high pass and proficiency rates in most core subjects.
 This reflects their actual levels in the good and outstanding lessons, especially in Cycle 1 and in Arabic in Cycle 2, which accounts for three quarters of the lessons.
- The senior leadership inspires and encourages school staff in an exemplary manner. It instills positive relationships by allowing everyone to work within an integrated system, adopting the principle of sharing decision-taking. This, in turn, spreads enthusiasm among all the staff.
- The self-evaluation is accurate and comprehensive. The results are used to build the school plans and develop programmes and projects that highlight the relevance to subjects and students' needs. These implemented and monitored through accurate and systematic mechanisms and their impact is significantly demonstrated in most core subjects' lessons, except for English, which is only satisfactory.
- The guidance and support programmes provided to students of various categories are effective, and

- significantly contributed in meeting their academic and personal needs.
- Students demonstrate high selfconfidence, prominent enthusiasm and great ability to assume leadership roles in school life.
- Most teachers apply teaching and learning strategies that motivate students towards learning. This is most evident in Cycle 1 and some of
- Cycle 2 lessons, though these are less inconsistent in English lessons in both cycles.
- The provision of student services and making use of the educational facilities, especially the Learning Resources Centre, are outstanding. Students and their parents are satisfied with the school's provision.

Main positive features

- The effectiveness of support and guidance programmes and the excellent use of school facilities to meet students' different academic and personal needs.
- Students' confident contribution to school life and their assumption of the responsibility of their own learning.
- The outstanding professional and human relationships between the school's leadership and its stakeholders, working together in an integrated operational system.

Recommendations

- Further develop students' acquisition of basic skills in English.
- Continue to develop teaching and learning processes in order to raise students' standards towards excellence through:
 - using assessment results to support low achievers
 - developing students' higher order thinking skills and challenging their abilities.
- Address the shortage in human resources represented by senior teachers for class teaching and core subjects.

Judgement justifications

 The school has maintained its good performance in most aspects of schoolwork, namely academic achievement and teaching and learning, and its outstanding level in students' support and guidance. However, its performance level has regressed in personal development,

- leadership and management and its capacity to improve, from 'Outstanding' to 'Good'.
- of points of strength and areas for development. This awareness stems from the school's accurate comprehensive self–evaluation. Strategic planning is based on improvement priorities and supported with effective programmes and projects, with accurate and systematic monitoring mechanisms.
- The school leadership adopts the principles of sharing its mission, vision, decision-taking and teamwork.
 A second staff leaders are selected and coached, such as assigning competent teachers the role of the senior teachers in class teaching and core subjects departments
- The school's judgements as stated in the self-evaluation form (SEF) match those reached by the review team.
