

Introduction

The Directorate of Government Schools Reviews (DGS), which is a part of the Education & Training Quality Authority (BQA), conducted this review over three days by a team of eight reviewers. During the review, reviewers observed lessons and other activities, scrutinised students' written works and analysed the school's performance data and other documents. They spoke to the staff, students and parents. This report summarises their findings and recommendations.

Judgement justifications

- The school has maintained its satisfactory performance in academic achievement and teaching and learning, while it has improved its performance in the other aspects from satisfactory to good.
- The school's self-evaluation is accurate and comprehensive. Its results are used to build strategic and operational plans with clear and accurate development priorities.
- Students' proficiency rates are inconsistent, the highest being in line with their levels in the good lessons, particularly in science subjects, while

- the lowest are in line with their levels in more than half the lessons of core and specialist subjects, which were satisfactory and inadequate as in Arabic, English, literary track subjects and some mathematics subjects.
- The majority of teachers are inconsistent in their investment in learning time, in use of assessment methods and in the use of the results to support students, particularly low achievers.
- Most students express their opinions with confidence, lead school activities

- and events actively and communicate with each other in school committees.
- The various targeted extracurricular programmes support all groups of students in a way that enhances their
- experiences and enables them to acquire life skills.
- Students and parents are satisfied with the school's provision.

Main positive features

- The accuracy of strategic planning processes and consideration of schoolwork priorities, which show in the positive development of most aspects of schoolwork.
- The eminent personal characteristics of most students in leading school activities and events, and their confidence in expressing their opinions when they communicate within school committees.
- The planned and targeted extracurricular programmes which support all groups of students.

Recommendations

- Raise students' academic achievement levels and develop their basic skills, especially in mathematics, English and literary track subjects.
- Develop teaching and learning, to include:
 - more efficient use of assessment for learning
 - productive management of learning time, to ensure achieving learning goals
 - further in-class academic support to low achieving students.
- Address the shortfall in human resources represented by senior teachers for Arabic, mathematics and commercial subjects.

Judgement justifications

- The school leadership is aware of the school's strengths and areas for development. The self-evaluation processes are accurate and their results are used to identify schoolwork priorities and develop the strategic
- plan, with clear monitoring mechanisms.
- The school delegates responsibilities to some teachers to cover the shortfall in senior teachers' positions for the

- Arabic, mathematics and commercial subjects departments.
- The school's ranking has improved from 11th place to 6th place in the final examination pass rates index across secondary schools for the second semester of the year 2016-2017.
- The school's performance has improved from satisfactory to good in students' personal development, support and guidance and leadership, management and governance.
- The impact of the professional development programmes shows

- clearly in the improvement of pass and proficiency rates over the past two years, and in the effective employment of teaching and learning strategies in the good lessons.
- The school's assessments of its performance as stated in the Self-Evaluation Form (SEF) are consistent with the judgements reached by the review team in most aspects of schoolwork.
