

Purpose

- Measuring core areas of literacy (Writing, Reading, and Listening)
- Developing the ability of Grade 9 students to use English effectively for the purposes of practical communication
- Forming a sound base for the skills required for further study using English as the medium.

Exam Level

1	Writing a transactional email.	Students write a transactional email in (80-100) words. The task will comprise 3 functions, for example, describe/explain/justify etc.		8	
2	Write a short piece of continuous prose.	Students write (100-120) words of continuous prose, in response to given input. Each year, the task will require students to write one of the following: a story, a report or an essay. Students will not be given a set of tasks to choose from.	60 min	12

Part	Competency	Description	Duration	Marks		
1	Identifying detail, attitude, purpose and opinion.	 - 5 Short monologues and dialogues (70-90 words each) between two different speakers (male and female) of typical daily situations in informal contexts tested mainly by visual material. - 5 x 3-option MCQs which may include words, numbers or visuals; with an example. 	Approximately 25 min	5		
2	Demonstrating general comprehension of detailed information.	- A monologue testing factual information. (400 – 450 words) - 5 x 3-option MCQs. Initial example included.		5

Listening Example – Part 2

How to do the Listening

- Students will be given the question paper and the answer sheet.
- Students will listen to the CD which includes:
 - the exams instructions
 - the rubrics
- Students have time to read the questions.
- While listening, students answer the questions on the question paper.
- Students hear the recording twice.
- Students complete and check their answers.
- Students have 5 minutes to copy their answers onto the separate bubble answer sheet.
- Students hand in the bubble answer sheet only without the question paper.



Why is it recommended to answer the questions on the question paper first?

Reading Example – Part 4




Julia's best friend Lisa has just moved into a new house and **needs things** for her bedroom. Julia wants to make something that Lisa can put on her wall.

- Increase students' awareness of the importance of the National Examinations
