Al-Jazeera Primary Boys School Al Nabeeh Saleh – Capital Government Kingdom of Bahrain



Introduction

The Directorate of Government Schools Reviews (DGS), which is a part of the Education & Training Quality Authority (BQA), conducted this review over three days by a team of four reviewers. During the review, reviewers observed lessons and other activities, scrutinised students' written works and analysed the school's performance data and other documents. They spoke to the staff, students and parents. This report summarises their findings and recommendations.

Judgement justifications

- Students achieve high pass rates and very high proficiency rates in all core subjects, reflecting their actual standards in the good lessons in most core subjects which account for more than two thirds of lessons observed.
- Students' commitment to good behaviour is outstanding. The harmony among them during different activities, apparent in the friendly relationships between them and their mutual respect to each other and to teachers, reflects their great sense of psychological security.
- The effectiveness of strategic planning has a positive effect on the different aspects of school work, supported by the effective utilisation of the limited school facilities and resources.
- Communication with local community institutions and the fruitful partnership parents to support school with activities and promote students' experiences and life knowledge is outstanding, enabling the school to achieve students' and parents' satisfaction.
- The support and close monitoring of students is effective, further

contributing to resolving their problems and meeting their personal needs.

 The use of effective teaching and learning strategies by most teachers motivates the students to learn. This is evident in most core subjects, though inconsistent in English lessons.

Main positive features

- Students' outstanding behaviour and their sense of psychological security.
- The fruitful and excellent communication with parents and the local community in a manner that nourishes students' experiences and knowledge.
- The good use of educational strategies and the effective use of the school's resources.
- Sensitivity in supporting students when they face problems and in meeting their personal needs.

Recommendations

- Benefit from positive practices in school, developing teaching and learning to a greater extent by focusing more on:
 - developing basic English skills
 - supporting low-achieving students effectively.
- Further monitor the impact of professional development programmes on the performance of teachers, in line with the requirements of the class teaching system and the particular needs of the various age groups.
- Address the shortfall in human resources represented by teachers for class teaching.

Judgement justifications

- The school's leadership and members are aware of the strengths and areas for development, based on an accurate and comprehensive self-evaluation and strategic planning that greatly focuses on improvement and development. To achieve the school's objectives and meet the needs of school members in
- light of the shortage in teachers for class teaching and in line with the age range of students, the school delegates teachers previously assigned for Grade 4 to teach Cycle 1 students.
- There is inconsistency between the 'outstanding' assessments the school states in the self-evaluation form for its

- work aspects and the 'good' judgements reached by the review team.
- The impact of school improvements is good on:
 - students' self-confidence and enthusiasm in participating in school activities
 - students' feeling of psychological security, their outstanding behaviour, their respect to everyone and their consideration of others' feelings
- the comprehensive personal support provided to students, which contributes to solving their problems and enhancing their personal development
- the use of effective teaching and learning strategies in most lessons
- the development and enrichment of students' experiences and knowledge.
