Short Monitoring Visit Report

Jaber Bin Hayian Primary Boys School Al-Duraz – Northern Governorate Kingdom of Bahrain

Date of first monitoring visit: 3 May 2018

Introduction

The monitoring visit of the school took place over one day, by a monitoring team from the Directorate of Government Schools Reviews (DGS) of the Education & Training Quality Authority (BQA) to verify the improvements that it enacted according to the recommendations of the last review visit. During the monitoring visit, improvement in students' performance is evaluated during the class observation, the learning walk, scrutiny of their written works and monitoring of general progress.

The Previous Judgement

The school was judged 'Inadequate' in the May 2017 review visit.

The overall outcomes of the visit

In order to have sufficient measures and improvements, the school is required to continue:

- Seeking the support provided by the concerned parties at the Ministry of Education (MoE) to ensure raising the overall performance of the school and taking the required measures to:
 - increase students' awareness and managing their behaviour
 - ensure continuous maintenance of school premises
 - address the shortfall of human resources represented by senior teacher for class teaching, a nurse and counselling team to match students' numbers.
- The implementation of an accurate self-evaluation of the school reality, and utilising its results in developing the strategic plan to ensure its focus on developmental priorities, and inclusion of accurate performance indicators and clear monitoring mechanisms
- Implementation of effective teaching and learning strategies to include:
 - students' acquisition of basic skills in all core subjects
 - effective assessment methods and utilising their results in supporting students of all categories in lessons and written works
 - class management to ensure productivity
 - students' active roles, self-confidence development and ability to take responsibilities.
- Providing extracurricular activities and programmes that meet the learning needs of all categories of students.

Additional remarks

 Address the shortfall in human resources represented by senior teachers for English and mathematics.
