Read the text about Paul A. Smith.

It is not just a typing machine!

It seems that God helped Paul A. Smith to design and build a new house! Despite being disabled in speech and movement, and not managing to receive any education, Paul concentrated on becoming a well-known master in his own special way. He became good at playing chess, but his real skill was in drawing pictures using an old-fashioned typing machine called a typewriter.

After Paul was born in 1921 in Pennsylvania, where his father and mother lived in a house in Kingsessing, his family moved to Florida, where he was raised until his parents died, and he moved to a nursing home in Oregon.

Unable to use his arms, Paul couldn't do things for himself. So how could he draw pictures? He couldn't speak because he couldn't control his mouth. Unable to walk, he found a way to express himself. Bending over his legs, he discovered his technique for using the typewriter. He could use his left hand to control the other and then press the key.

As his control of the typewriter grew stronger, he developed techniques to create shadows and colours that made his work less plain and similar to common pencil drawings. In all, Paul made hundreds of pictures, some of which took months to complete. He kept prints of his work to develop his technique, but also gave original pictures to friends as gifts.

He had no wife or children to look after him. So in 1967, he entered a retirement home. There he continued creating pictures and playing chess until 2004 when eye problems brought this to an end, and he was left to enjoy his other great love – American football games.

Paul's work has interested journalists since 1946, when "Handicapped Boy Produces Art" appeared in a newspaper. Magazines contain articles about him by famous writers, while publishers are waiting in line to produce his biography. He died in 2007, leaving many artists encouraged to create similar art.
