Interviewer: Good Morning listeners! Today we are talking with Matthew Round, a language

Matthew: Hi, thank you for having me here. Well, I love languages! I taught myself to speak six languages fluently and I can understand several more. I learnt Greek when I was young, maybe that's why I found languages easy. I can honestly say, if you speak other languages then you can talk to the world. So today, I'd like to share some top tips with you on how to learn languages.

Interviewer: Learning a language can be challenging for some, how do you keep focused?

Matthew: I think you need to have a good reason to learn a language, otherwise, you won't stay motivated. Learning a new language to show off to a friend isn't enough. My brother Mark and I learn languages together and it really encourages me to keep going. Some people talk to themselves in the new language while they're learning. This could be a good way to practise and help to build your confidence too.

Interviewer: So, in your opinion, what's the best way to learn a language?

Matthew: There're several learning techniques. Some people think that staying in the place where the language is spoken is the best way to learn. However, I believe that you'll benefit more from staying at home, where you can communicate, understand, and interact with daily situations, just by using the internet. A more traditional approach is to learn grammar rules and then apply them by translating sentences, which isn't, in my opinion, the perfect way to develop speaking skills.

Interviewer: There are many language learning applications, but are they really beneficial?

Matthew: These applications do seem to be popular with many people. They're easy to access on your phone or device, and people who don't have time can learn wherever they are. However, you can't use them to learn how to read or write in the language. They're designed more for speaking, and many people are using language learning applications just before they travel to a new country to be able to communicate using the local language.

Interviewer: And which foreign language is the British favourite?

Matthew: I think German is the easiest language for British people to learn. This is because of its basic grammar rules and word order, which are similar to English. Research suggests that in Britain, for historical reasons, French is still the most popular language to learn. Experts say that even though learning Spanish is straightforward for many people because of the easy pronunciation the British find the grammar rules complicated.

Interviewer: So Matthew, what's your secret to learning another language?

Matthew: My answer is simple. There is no secret. You really don't need to take any expensive language-learning courses, especially if you're on a budget. The simplest way is to take a child's attitude, like a desire to play in the language and to laugh at mistakes. It's true that some people like to use a new language creatively by writing songs, poems, or stories. But not everyone can do this.

Interviewer: And, do you have any worries about the future of languages?

Matthew: There're more than 6,000 languages spoken globally at present, but what really worries language specialists is the prediction that around 90% of world languages are likely to die out. Many parents are annoyed that their children are not learning their native languages, because today's youth don't think it will be useful. Also, there're certain cultures and smaller economies which will struggle to survive because they're unable to speak the main business languages of English and Chinese.
