

- ➤ Measuring your ability to analyse information and data and come up with solutions based on real-life situations.
- ➤ Measuring your applied language and computational skills.
- ➤ Providing appropriate support to evaluate your abilities for university choices.
- ➤ Measuring your skills, knowledge and core competencies that contribute to your participation in building the knowledge-based economy and society.

Students' Guidelines

Dear student, during the national examinations, be sure to consider the following points:


- > Set a timetable to review and practise the past national examinations samples.
- > Ensure you have a healthy breakfast.
- Arrive at school well ahead of the examination's start time.
- > Bring all the necessary tools and materials you may need.
- > You will not be allowed to leave the examinations hall until half of the designated examination time has passed.
- > Bring the official ID card or a copy of it.
- > Read the question paper carefully before answering the questions.
- > Do not write your personal information on the examination paper or answer sheet.
- > You must refrain from asking the invigilator to explain the examination questions.
- Make sure to answer all the questions in the paper before handing it to the invigilator.


You will face partial or complete grade deprivation in the following cases:


- > Causing disturbance in the examination hall.
- > Possessing of any unauthorised materials.
- > Communicating with other students in any form.
- Cheating or violating instructions in any form.
- > Taking the examination in another student's name or on their behalf.
- Seeking help or providing assistance to another student.

Parents' Guidelines

Dear Parents

The national examinations are conducted annually for Grade 9 and Grade 12 students with different purposes for the examinations in these two grades. The purpose of Grade 9 national examinations is to assess students' abilities and skills within the competencies of the national curriculum at the end of basic education. The purpose of Grade 12 national examinations is to measure students' achievement of educational objectives in the Kingdom of Bahrain after completing 12 years of study.



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- Ensure to review the schedule of the national examinations and inform your child about it in advance.
- 2 Encourage your child to practise on past national examination samples.
- Create a suitable home environment to facilitate studying and preparing for the national examinations.
- Ensure that students arrive early at school with the necessary stationery tools.

School Administrations' Guidelines

Before the implementation of the National Examinations

- > Increase students' awareness of the importance of the national examinations.
- > Enhance students' self-confidence and provide a supportive environment for them.
- Provide students and parents with the national examinations schedule.
- Prepare the teaching and administrative staff for the organisational aspects of conducting the national examinations.
- Prepare in advance the examination halls, the necessary tools and devices for conducting the national examinations.
- ➤ Ensure that the examinations halls are free of any supporting educational materials.
- Attend the briefing meetings held by the Education and Training Quality Authority (BQA) and disseminate the information to the relevant individuals in the school.
- Utilise the publications issued by BQA.

During the implementation of the National Examinations

- Ensure receiving all national examination materials from the designated distribution centre.
- > Report any behavioural or administrative violations to the BQA.
- > Facilitate the quality check of the school by BQA representatives.
- Display a copy of the instructions of the national examinations inside the examinations hall.

After the implementation of the National Examinations

- ➤ Ensure the safety of students' answer sheets, preventing damage and loss, and return them to the distribution centre within the specified time after the examinations.
- ➤ Keep copies of the attendance register, seating plans, and any instructions or correspondence between the BQA and the school in a specified file.

Markers' Guidelines


The procedures that must be followed to ensure the success of the national examinations marking process:

Arrive early at the marking centre, and adhere to the BQA laws and regulations throughout the marking process

Ensure you sign the confidentiality agreement

Ensure to read the 'Markers' Instructions' before starting the marking process

Commit to writing the marking report upon completing the examinations marking process



Complete the fingerprint procedures and sign your contract before starting the marking process

Adhere to the organisational structure of the marking panel by attending the specified teams according to the designated tables assigned to each team headed by the team leader

Attend the standardisation meeting to learn about the key standards of the national examination marking process and to ensure sufficient understanding of them before commencing the marking process

Sign the attendance report at the end of the marking period
