Importance of National Examinations

What benefits do you get from the national examinations as a Grade 12 student?

It is a measurement tool that helps you with the following aspects:

- Measuring your academic achievement at the end of secondary stage.
- Identifying your strengths and areas for improvement for your university study.
- Motivating you to stand out and compete positively.
- Measuring your ability to analyse information and data and come up with solutions based on real-life situations.
- Measuring your applied language and computational skills.
- Providing appropriate support to evaluate your abilities for university choices.
- Measuring your skills, knowledge and core competencies that contribute to your participation in building the knowledge-based economy and society.

What benefits do you get from the national examinations as a Grade 9 student?

It is a measurement tool that helps you with the following aspects:

- Measuring your academic achievement at the end of Grade 9.
- Identifying your strengths and areas for improvement before moving to the secondary stage.
- Motivating you to stand out and compete positively in order to improve your skills, knowledge and basic competencies.
- Measuring your linguistic skills and scientific and mathematical abilities and knowledge, by applying them to real-life situations.

Students' Guidelines

Dear student, during the national examinations, be sure to consider the following points:

- Set a timetable to review and practise the past national examinations samples.
- Ensure you have a healthy breakfast.
- Arrive at school well ahead of the examination's start time.
- Bring all the necessary tools and materials you may need.
- You will not be allowed to leave the examinations hall until half of the designated examination time has passed.
- Bring the official ID card or a copy of it.
- Read the question paper carefully before answering the questions.
- Do not write your personal information on the examination paper or answer sheet.
- You must refrain from asking the invigilator to explain the examination questions.
- Make sure to answer all the questions in the paper before handing it to the invigilator.

You will face partial or complete grade deprivation in the following cases:

- Causing disturbance in the examination hall.
- Possessing of any unauthorised materials.
- Communicating with other students in any form.
- Cheating or violating instructions in any form.
- Taking the examination in another student's name or on their behalf.
- Seeking help or providing assistance to another student.
